LET'S REVISE THE PRESENT PERFECT!

- 1 A Has he won the competition? B No, he hasn't.
- 2 A Have you ever been to Iceland? B Yes, I have.
- To make yes/no questions, we use Have/Has + subject + past participle.

Quest	ions (?)		Short answers
Have	I/you/we/they	eaten?	Yes, I/you/we/they have . No, I/you/we/they haven't .
Has	he/she/it		Yes, he/she/it has . No, he/she/it hasn't .

- We use the present perfect to say something happened before now but we don't know or say when. We often use it with ...
 - 1 *ever* in questions; *ever* means *at any time in your life*. It goes between the subject and the main verb.
 - Has he **ever** written a novel? Yes, he has./No, he hasn't.
 - 2 never to talk about experiences that did not happen. It means at no time in your life and goes after have/has and before the main verb.

I haven't acted in a play. → I've **never** acted in a play.

 - 1 to say something happened before now and we know the time.

 - 2 with finished time expressions, e.g. last week, yesterday, etc. I watched lots of horror films when I was a teenager. NOT t've seen lots of horror films when I was a teenager.
- We often start with the present perfect and then change to the past simple to give more details.
 - A Have you ever stayed in an expensive hotel?
 - B Yes, I stayed at the Shangri-La last September.
 - A Did you enjoy it?
 - B Yes, I did. It was amazing!
