Phrasal verbs are phrases that indicate actions. They are generally used in spoken English and informal texts. They consist of a verb with a preposition or adverb or both, the meaning of which is different from the meaning of its separate parts.

Verb	Preposition/adverb
get	up
go	through
write	down
take	after
